

OUR MISSION

To provide immediate short-term assistance with basic necessities to Yolo County families and individuals with income below the poverty level.



STEAC is committed to enlarging the social awareness of the community and to keep providing opportunities for local citizens to help others in need.

HISTORY

In 1967, late spring rains inundated the rural areas of Yolo County, keeping many of the county's migrant workers from the fields. Without income, they had no way to pay for food or housing. STEAC was born to provide emergency aid to them. It was ran solely by volunteers. Today, STEAC still relies on volunteers for the majority of our programs.

FUNDING

About 85% of STEAC's income is from individual donations. This provides funding for operations, special projects, and growing needs. The remaining funds are provided by private and government grants. Individual donors also provide support with gifts of stocks, bonds, mutual funds and other non-cash items. STEAC also receives support from bequests, memorials, and other planned gifts.

STEAC is a public benefit, nonprofit corporation with tax exempt status under section 501(c)(3) or the IRS Code (TAX ID: 94-6138684).

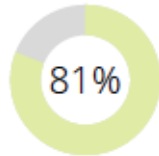
Homeless Prevention

STEAC helps Yolo County's low-income residents through a temporary housing emergency with these services:

RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Preventing Evictions

STEAC provides emergency rental assistance to ensure that low-income residents can pay current or past due rent and not be evicted from their homes.

FIRST MONTH'S RENT

Helping Overcome Housing Barriers

STEAC provides cash assistance to help those currently homeless pay for first month's rent and/or housing deposits for long-term housing.

UTILITY ASSISTANCE

Keeping Power On

Cash assistance is given to residents in order to prevent their utilities from being turned off or to have them restored.

BILL PAY

Extends help to low income families who have bills they cannot afford including for basic necessities.

FREE FOOD

Feeding Families in Need

STEAC provides 5 days worth of food to Davis residents from the STEAC Food Pantry. This service is available twice a month to each qualifying applicant.
